


Letter from the Director

From the Archives



This is an original leaf from an illuminated manuscript of the Koran, dated 1207 A.D. An illuminated manuscript is a manuscript in which the text is supplemented with such decoration as initials, borders (marginalia), and miniature illustrations.

This leaf was donated from the Biblical Library of Stanley S. Slotkin. Mr. Slotkin donated books and pieces of historical value to museums and academic institutions throughout the United States, and is credited with the discovery of the Cave of the Nativity, the site that Christians have recognized as the birthplace of Jesus Christ since 325 A.D., in Bethlehem.
